Opening late-2027

Micah Projects is creating a Health and Housing Hub in South Brisbane. The Hub will provide **free** health and social support services for people experiencing hardship, isolation, or challenges accessing the care that they need.

Located at 6 Cordelia Street, South Brisbane, the Hub will bring together healthcare professionals, community workers, and support services in one welcoming and accessible place – making it easier for people to find care, connection, and support when they need it.



Building this vision

For more than 30 years, Micah Projects has been committed to supporting people experiencing adversity, exclusion, and injustice, working towards a more compassionate and inclusive community.

Building on this commitment, Micah Projects has advocated for the development of a Health and Housing Hub in South Brisbane – a place where people can access healthcare, support, connection, and care in one welcoming place.

The Hub will bring together health, housing, and community services to help break down barriers to care and create better pathways to wellbeing. Through coordinated, trauma-informed support, the Hub will strengthen connections, improve access to services, and contribute to a more inclusive and equitable future for people in our community.

In the lead-up to opening, Micah Projects will work with health, housing, and community partners – including people with lived experience – to help shape the Health and Housing Hub and ensure it responds to the needs of the community.



Supporting our community

When the Health and Housing Hub opens in late 2027, it will provide a range of **free** health, wellbeing and support services. Some services will be available from opening, with others introduced over time as the Hub grows.

By bringing the following services together in one place, the Hub will make it easier for people to access the care, support and connection they need.



Bulk-billed GP care



Women's health services



Dental care



Education, research and training



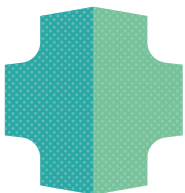
Peer support and wellbeing programs

Helping people access the care they need earlier, reducing avoidable visits to hospitals and emergency departments.

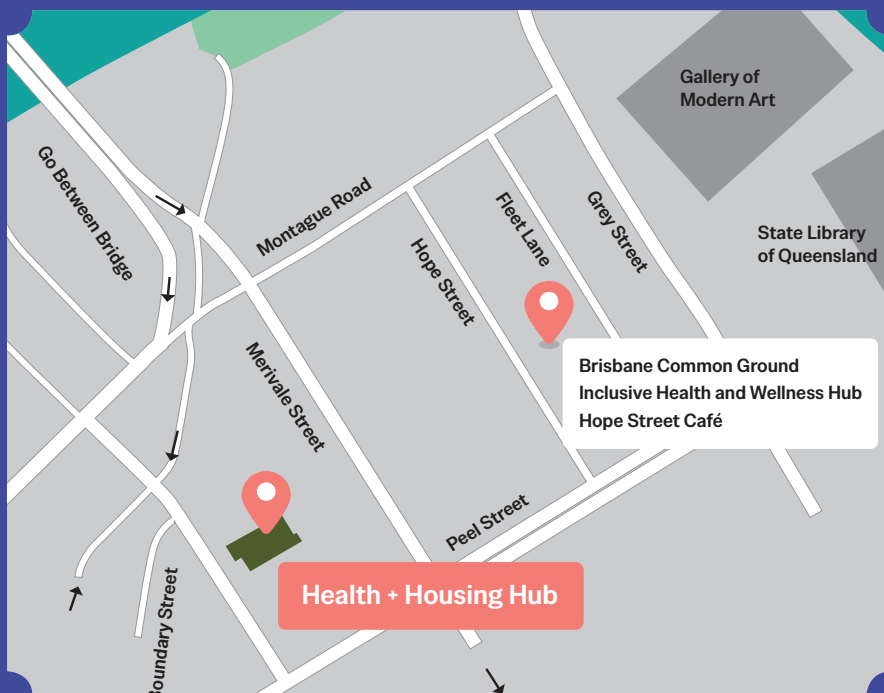
Providing early support to help people avoid a crisis or becoming homeless.
